

#### **EXPLANATORY EXERCISES**

#### LINE WISE EXPLANATION:-

**Line no. – 1)** I wonder why the grass is so green, **Explanation** – The child wants to know why the colour of the grass is green.

**Line no. – 2)** And why the wind is never seen?

**Explanation** – The child wonders why she can only feel the wind but cannot see the wind.
