## TOPIC: NOUN NUMBER

READ THE PASSAGE CAREFULLY AND ANSWER THE FOLLOWING QUESTIONS.
THERE ARE TWO NUMBERS IN ENGLISH:

1) Singular Number
2) Plural Number
3) Singular Number: Any noun that stands for only one person or thing is said to be in the singular number, eg. Chair, man.
4) Plural Number: Any noun that stands for more than one person or thing is said to be in the plural number, eg. Chairs, men.
Only countable nouns can have a plural form.

## RULES FOR CHANGING FROM SINGULAR TO PLURAL:

1) For the plural form of most nouns, add -S : cup- cups, desk- desks.
2) For nouns that end in Ch, $X, S$ or s sounds, add- es : eg.: Box- boxes.
3) For nouns ending in $f$ or fe change $f$ to $v$ and add- es : eg.: wife- wives.
4) Some nouns have different plural forms : child- children, woman- women.
5) Nouns ending in vowels like y or o do not have definite rules : potato- potatoes, stereo- stereos.
6) A few nouns have the same singular and plural forms : sheep- sheep, deer- deer, species- species.
7) By adding -s to the principal word in compound nouns : passer-by - passers-by.
