THERE ARE TWO NUMBERS IN ENGLISH:

- 1) Singular Number 2) Plural Number
- **1) Singular Number**: Any noun that stands for only one person or thing is said to be in the singular number, eg. Chair, man.
- **2) Plural Number:** Any noun that stands for more than one person or thing is said to be in the plural number, eg. Chairs, men.

Only countable nouns can have a plural form.

RULES FOR CHANGING FROM SINGULAR TO PLURAL:

- 1) For the plural form of most nouns, add -S: cup-cups, desk-desks.
- 2) For nouns that end in Ch, X, S or s sounds, add- es: eg.: Box- boxes.
- 3) For nouns ending in f or fe change f to v and add- es: eg.: wife- wives.
- 4) Some nouns have different plural forms: child-children, woman-women.
- 5) Nouns ending in vowels like y or o do not have definite rules: potato- potatoes, stereo- stereos.
- 6) A few nouns have the same singular and plural forms: sheep- sheep, deer- deer, species- species.
- 7) By adding -s to the principal word in compound nouns: passer-by passers-by.
