TOPIC: COUNTABLE AND UNCOUNTABLE NOUNS

Countable and Uncountable Nouns

- i. Countable Nouns are those that refer to something that can be counted. They have both singular and plural forms. Examples include: cat/ cats; woman/ women; country/ countries, etc. in the singular they can be preceded by a or an.
- **ii. Uncountable Nouns** do not typically refer to things that can be counted and so they do not regularly have a plural form. Examples include: rain, rice, water, wood, etc. Uncountable nouns can't be preceded by **a** or **an.** Many abstract nouns are typically uncountable like *happiness*, *danger*, *truth*, *darkness*, *love*, etc.

Note: Countable Nouns can be Singular and Plural. Example: one banana, two bananas. We use words like a, one, two, few, many, a pen, one boy, two hens, few men many children.

With Uncountable Nouns we use words like little, (a little) much, a little water, much help.

Some Nouns can be both Countable and Uncountable.
