## **Topic- Subject and Predicate**

INSTRUCTIONS: Parents kindly help the child read and understand the text carefully and answer the questions given at the end of the topics.

Every sentence that we speak or write consists of two parts.

- 1. We must talk about some person or thing.
- 2. We must say something about that person or thing.

In grammar, that about which something is said is called the Subject. What is said about the Subject is called the Predicate.

A Subject is a noun or pronoun while every Predicate is either a verb or contains a verb because no Predicate can be formed without a verb.

Examine these sentences:

# **Hidden Subject**

Sometimes in a sentence, the Subject is not clearly mentioned. This kind of Subject is implied or understood

#### For eg:

- Sit down (Subject: You).
- Pick up the book (Subject: You).
- Bring my medicine (Subject: You).

Here the subject "you" is not mentioned, it is understood. Such Subjects are called **hidden subjects.**
