Summary:

Nationalism is a sentiment based on common cultural characteristics that binds a population and often produces a policy of national independence or separatism. It involves the feeling of oneness and brotherhood for your own countrymen.

Partition of Bengal

The decision took effect the Partition of Bengal was announced in July 1905 by the Viceroy of India, Lord Curzon. The partition took effect in October 1905 and separated the largely Muslim eastern areas from the largely Hindu western areas. The reason behind the partition that was officially announced was that the Bengal province was too large to be administered by a single governor and therefore was partitioned on administrative purpose. But the real reason behind the partition was political and not administrative. East Bengal was dominated by the Muslims and West Bengal by the Hindus. Partition was yet another part of the 'Divide and rule' policy.

Revolutionary Nationalism:

There was a rise in the growth of revolutionary activities, the government banned shouting of "Bande Matram", the government expelled the students who participated in this movement. The government policy of terror and repression brought the question of using terror against terror. The attitude of the youths was also to take revenge. This led to the growth of revolutionaries disposition by the Jugantar group of Calcutta, the Anushilani Samiti of Dhaka and the AbhinavBharat in Maharashtra.
