GENDER



Nouns are words that name people, animals, places and things. They are also called naming words. Some nouns name specifically males and females. In grammar, the word "gender" is used to describe this feature of nouns.

Gender is defined as a classification of **noun** or **pronoun** as –

- 1) Masculine 😳
- 2) Feminine (

Nouns or **pronouns** referring to **males** are said to be of the **masculine gender**.

For example: boy, man, father, peacock, lion, he, him etc. (Et cetera).

Nouns or **pronouns** referring to **females** are said to be of the **feminine gender.**

For example: girl, woman, mother, peahen, lioness, she, her etc. (Et cetera).

NOTE: There are 4 types of gender — masculine, feminine, neuter and common but at class 2 level we will consider only two types that is masculine and feminine gender as described above.

Explanatory examples 🖄

Example -1)

My aunt is an actress.

In the example given above both the words that is **aunt** and **actress** are used for **females** or **feminine gender**. If we change the gender of these words that is if we change them into masculine gender the sentence would be rewritten as follows:-

My uncle is an actor.

Now in this sentence both uncle and actor are used for males or masculine gender.

Example - 2)

The father loved his son very much

In the example given above father, his and

son all are used for males or masculine gender where father and son are "nouns" but his is a "pronoun" used in place of "noun" (masculine gender). If we change the gender of these three words that is if we change them into feminine gender the sentence would be rewritten as follows:-

The mother loved her daughter very much.
