## Q1. Read the extract given below and answer the questions that follow:

- (v) What is the 'home' he is planting? Where and for whom is he planting the 'home'?

## Q2. Read the extract given below and answer the questions that follow:

- (i) How has the poet described the tree earlier in the poem?
- (ii) Which line in the poem is repeated, and why?
