Car racing is a thrilling sport. It tests the skills of the drivers, the speed capabilities of the vehicles, and the endurance of both. In 1887, the first car race took place. It was in France and the distance was just 2 kilometers. In later years, the car races became 1000 kilometers long and took two days to complete.

Later, people made a race course and arranged races for a fixed number of rounds, called laps. The first such race took place in Chicago in 1895.

The first competition in India was held in 1905. It was a race from Delhi to Mumbai for a distance of 1300 kilometers. Very soon, car makers started making cars for racing. They were different from the usual cars for the public. Racing cars have space for just one person. These cars are very light.

The best known variety of car racing today is called Formula 1 or F1. It is a championship for drivers and their teams. Every year in India, F1 races take place near New Delhi. The cars have to complete a distance of 308 kilometers.
